The Position:

Reporting to the Network Programs and Planning Manager, the Network Relations Coordinator provides support to agencies serviced by The Food Bank of Waterloo Region through the development and execution of communication and training plans. This position works closely with the Marketing & Communications team of The Food Bank and will support other project teams as needed with tasks and activities related to Network relations.



The short-term responsibilities of this role may change from year-to-year, as priorities of The Food Bank change, and will be detailed in the Network Relations Coordinator annual work plan.

This role will contribute to the communications and relationship building with over 100+ community programs in the community providing food assistance.

Responsibilities include:

- Planning and execution of a communication plan for agency partners including a monthly enewsletter
- Organize and conduct regular face-to-face meetings with agency partners to further develop relationships and better understand program needs
- Facilitating agency program training, including an annual forum, training videos and in person training sessions
- Create, proofread, edit and update marketing materials with support from the Communications Specialist

- Support Network research and evaluation activities
- Complete administration tasks related to agency staff/volunteer entry of information in a cloud based database including, data clean up, ensuring correct entry of data and training
- Support other activities related to serving the 100+ community programs and agency partners throughout Waterloo Region

Hours of Work:

The Food Bank's public hours of operation are from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Due to the nature of the organization it is understood that irregular hours and hours above and beyond are included in your salary, but shall not exceed guidelines of the Employment Standards Act.
